



Getting married in Aruba

The Aruba Marriott Resort & Stellaris Casino offers many beautiful, outdoor locations for your wedding ceremony: directly on the white, sandy beach, or picturesque areas around the pool and our tropical garden.

The best time of day to hold the ceremony is right before sunset, which varies from 6 - 6:15 pm depending on the time of year.

Aruban law allows non-residents to be married on the island. All necessary documents will need to be submitted a minimum of 1 month prior to the wedding date to our wedding planner on property, so that there is enough time to process the paperwork.

The most important documents are:

- Letter of non-impediment (proof of marital status)
- Certified copy of birth certificate
- Copy of valid passport
- Copy of passport of witness if any

If you prefer to have a civil marriage performed in your own country and have only the religious ceremony done on the island you will need to submit a copy of the signed, official marriage certificate to the minister who will perform the ceremony prior to the event.

THE GINGER LILY WEDDING

Photographs are taken of the couple both during and after the blessing on the resort's white sand beach, in front of the Kunuku house, or within the resort's manicured gardens. Champagne and cake are served after the ceremony amid the sounds of a sweet Caribbean steel drum rhythm.
